## Notes 6.4 - What Have the Romans Ever Done for Us?

## **Roman Government**

Roman Republic founded in 509 B.C.E.

Was a **representative democracy** which meant that unlike the Greeks, representatives were elected to make decisions

-Like the Greeks, only free male citizens voted for representatives

Had power divided across three branches of government:

Senate - the rich families and distinguished elders

Citizen **Assembly** and Tribunes (plebians)

- voice of the common people

**Consuls** - "Executive Branch" - two co-leaders to check each others power

- Had the power of **Veto** - (Latin for "I refuse")

Sharing of power and responsibility created **checks and balances** between the branches of government. If one branch was making irresponsible decisions, the other branches could block them.

## **Roman Law**

Laws called "**Twelve Tables**" were standardized across the entire Roman Empire. Citizens were protected by legal rights.

**Jury Trials** (borrowed from the Greeks) - the right to be judged by your peers.

What made the Romans so influential?

They conquered most of the areas around the Mediterranean Sea and brought "Pax Romana" (Roman Peace) for over 700 years.
