

## **Instructions for the Sub-Saharan Africa Mapping Project**

This is a map of the Sub-Saharan region. It will have both political and physical features. Only what is on the map will be assessed.

Remember to draw the entire map in pencil first, then come back and use a black ink pen, and finally, erase any stray pencil marks. Using the maps on my website or in the textbook atlas, draw in and label the following:

**Location Lines:** (drawn and labeled with the correct measure in degrees) Equator 0°, Prime Meridian 0°, Tropic of Cancer 23.5° N, Tropic of Capricorn 23.5° S.

**Countries:** (Should be written in all Capital Letters) Angola, Benin, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Congo, Cote D' Ivoire, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Djibouti, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mauritania, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, Niger, Nigeria, Rwanda, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, South Africa, Sudan, South Sudan, Swaziland, Tanzania, Togo, Uganda, Zambia, Zimbabwe

**Cities:** (Place a dot for the city and write as a proper noun, meaning - capitalize the first letter of the name) Cape Town, Dar es Salaam, Mogadishu, Monrovia, Kinshasa, Addis Ababa, Harare, Tripoli, Cairo, Algiers

**Rivers:** (write as a proper noun) Nile River, Congo River

**Mountains:** (write as a proper noun) Drakensberg Range, Air Mountains,

**Features:** (write as a proper noun) Congo Basin, Great Rift Valley

**Lakes:** (write as a proper noun) Lake Victoria, Lake Tanganyika

**Deserts:** (write as a proper noun) Nubian, Namib, Kalahari, Sahara

**Ocean Features:** (write as a proper noun) Cape of Good Hope, Red Sea, Gulf of Aden, Indian Ocean, Mediterranean Sea, Mozambique Channel, Atlantic Ocean, Gulf of Guinea, Gulf of Aden, Strait of Gibraltar

You will need **TODALS** (look on page 14 of your interactive notebook or the "class resources" of my website at [www.tangleworld.org](http://www.tangleworld.org))

**Pencil** in the entire map first, then go over the map with **black ink pen** (no Sharpies).

Color the map. Use only **color pencils**, no markers. Alternate the color of each country so that we can tell the difference between each. You can reuse colors. Blue is reserved for water.
