Unit 3 Summative Design Project - Phobos Moon Religion Cave

It is the Year 2062. Humans have begun to colonize other planets in our solar system, particularly Mars and Venus. Required Elements:

- Elements from all of the religions listed above should be present and labeled.
- Drawn projects can be in black ink and colored (think of map standards).
- The room on Phobos is laser cut from solid rock. The door is in the same place as my classroom door. You can lac things in front of the walls and paint them.
- It is up to your creativity to decide how to get all of these religions to work in the same space.
